News from St. Peter School - For the past several years, St. Peter School has participated in a twinning partnership with the schools of Notre Dame D'Altagrace Parish in Cap Haitien, Haiti: Notre Dame and St. Dominic's. This partnership has allowed us to share our Catholic identity with our sister schools in Haiti, as well as support a community in need of financial assistance. Through the creation of the Haiti Stewardship Committee, the St. Peter School community has raised awareness about our sister schools as well as critical funds for Haiti. This year, the students of St. Peter School have grown closer to our sister community through shared messages with Haitian students, communicating what life is like as a student in our respective countries. St. Peter School students have also learned about our sister community through a presentation by Peter Sloan of Archangel Airborne and helped to raise money to benefit our sister schools by supporting our annual Holiday Market. St. Peter School will continue the school year sharing

and learning about Haitian traditions and culture through our Mindfulness March programming that will focus on Haitian celebrations and through a visit to our school by a Haitian-inspired storyteller in April. We will continue to raise money to support our sister community through our Mother's Day gift sale and the sale of our Haitian block print cards.

## Pastor's Corner

For by your gracious gift each year (of Lent)
your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts

The above prayer is from the First Sunday of Lent and it is part of a prayer called the Preface. This prayer that ends, Holy, Holy, Holy...is the last oration said before the Eucharistic prayer in the Mass. It is supposed to bespeak what is in our heart; that which we hope to unite to the heart of Christ so that He can take it to the Father. I was so moved by these words in the middle of Mass that I almost had to stop. I just wanted to think about the words I had just said.

So I decided to share them again with you. Please feel free to cut this out and put this on your refrigerator, look at them in the morning and say them again in the evening. Constantly go back to the words of the Church so that Lent doesn't become a meaningless thing, but a song of angels and saints, sons and daughters.
